Many organizations are working to meet local demand for flowers and potted plants, develop attractive new varieties and help keep invasive species out of Hawai'i.

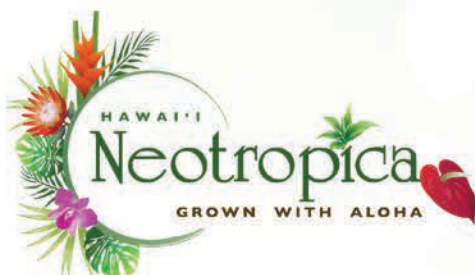
You can help by asking for locally grown flowers and plants to reduce imports that often carry invasive species.
